He shared his inspirational story of how he became an artist as a teenager after a chance encounter with Oscar Nemon, who lived on Boars Hill. You can visit his house, Pleasant Lands, and see his sculptures. Oscar Nemon was a refugee who created sculptures of Winston Churchill and Sigmund Freud. He showed us many of the amazing wax works he worked on including Princess Diana, Steven Gerrard and Dua Lipa. He left us with an important message about all of us as artists. "Make whatever you want to make, for your own enjoyment and for other people to enjoy. Be enthusiastic, ask questions, be keen to learn and people will want to help you."

We ended the week with the artist workshops led by Dionne Freeman from At the Bus. The children were inspired and created some beautiful portraits. Some of which you can see in this newsletter. A big thank you to FOWS for helping us to pay for the workshops!
