

Communication & Language

Circle time activities will help children to talk about new beginnings, differences and similarities. We will learn to recite, sequence stories and focus on describing the characters and their activities. Sound walks in nature will enable children to recognise different sound for Phonics.



Reading

Every day, children will listen to key texts and other relevant fiction and non-fiction books. We will learn how to handle books with care and share the passion for reading. They will be able to take books home to read with their parents. Phonics lesson will focus on environmental sound recognition first, before we introduce letters.

Problem solving and Maths

The children will be able to get to know the classroom and the available resources, whilst applying positional language. They will represent, compare and compose numbers between 1-3 and explore patterns



PE - Important Information.

PE is on a **Wednesday** all children must wear their PE kit when arriving to school. (A white T-shirt, black shorts or joggers and plimsolls.)



Understanding the world/Science.

The children will explore their 5 senses. Self-care, such as self-dressing, etc. is a topic which will be focused on throughout the Early Years Foundation Stage. We will look at autumn and harvest, by exploring the nature, textures and colours, as well as healthy eating.

How to help your child

- Self-dressing: fastening coats and shoes; putting on their PE kit and school uniform themselves.
- Reading and writing their first name (Capital letters and small letters.)
- counting up to 10
- Story time - reading out loud

Expressive Art and Design

The children will learn to recognise repeated sounds and sound patterns and match movements to music.

We will explore colours of autumn, use seasonal flowers as inspirations and look at patterns in nature.

Also, the children will learn about themselves and create self-portraits.

RE

The children will learn about harvest celebrations and sharing with others. We will read different stories, for example “The foolish farmer” and begin to understand Christianity.

Personal & Social Development

This term will be all about settling in and celebrating new beginnings.

We will talk about self-awareness and good health. (Tasting seasonal fruits and vegetables.)

Daily routines and school rules will be looked at, including carpet skills, independent toileting and hand washing. The children will take part in gross and fine motor activities, such as finger gym.
